The German Historical Institute of Washington is undertaking the “German Heritage in Letters” project to find, collect, and share historical correspondence in a digital collection that will be freely available online for use by researchers and interested parties from throughout the world. We thank you for your interest in being a contributor to the project and sharing your materials with us to enable their distribution and preservation in digital form.

For this and any future projects, we ask you to consent to our digitizing, electronically processing, permanently storing, and making available to the public the letters and other materials you have shared in either digital or analog form with us. In sharing your materials, we assume that you are authorized to allow their reproduction. We understand that this grant of permission is a non-exclusive agreement and that you are free to share these materials with other institutions and individuals. We promise in turn to take down any material that is found to be under copyright or whose reproduction is otherwise unauthorized. Users of the digital collection will have the opportunity to view the letters and associated documents or other materials online, free of charge, to download them, to store and process them electronically, and to publish them, citing their sourcing from our digital archive, on the same terms as on the portal. This is also known as a Creative Commons Attribution-ShareAlike 4.0 international licensing agreement (CC-BY-SA 4.0).

To set up the digital archive and for the operation of the online portal, we also make use of third-party services provided by partners in the United States and Germany, including the Thüringer Universitäts und Landesbibliothek (University and State Library of Thuringia), and thus we also request permission to transfer this consent to such third parties for these same purposes.

We are very grateful for your support of our project. Interest among scholars and others in working with this important source material and making these cultural assets relating to the history of German-American heritage and the history of migration over the past centuries available to the general public is strong. We are excited to learn from future visitors to our digital collection and share with you how these materials will be put to use in research, teaching, and other contexts.
